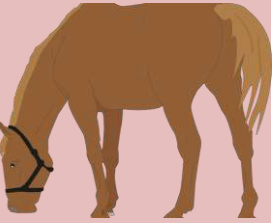

Nika's world Horses



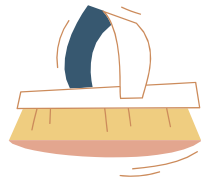
Hey! It's me Nika, one of the people who publish this newspaper. I'll tell you now, what's my favorite leisure activity.

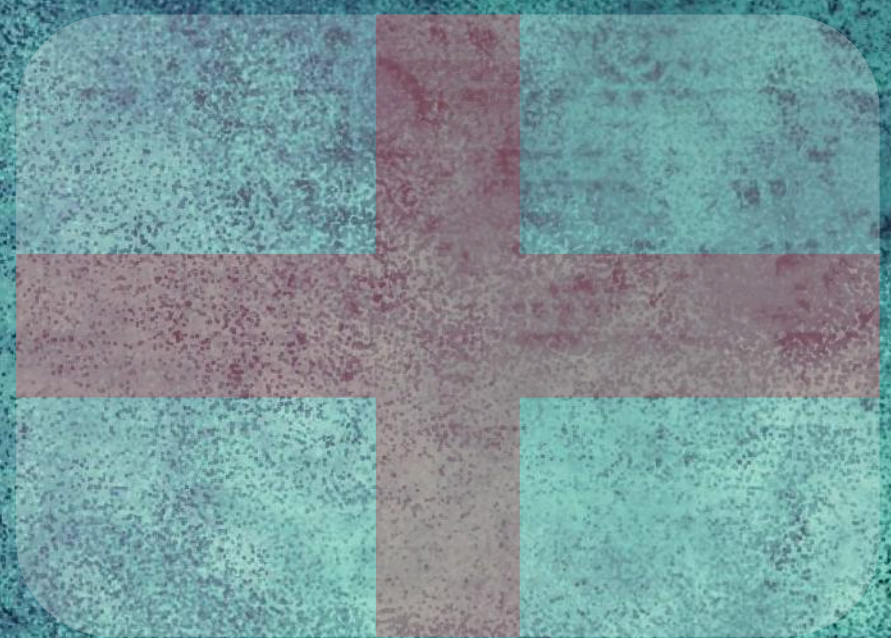

LIFE IN THE USA



Have you ever wondered what it's like to live in the United States of America? Well if you continue reading this article you will find out. I will cover everything from big cultural differences to the little things such as a type of food that's served at school.

The first difference we can talk about is elementary school (every school is obviously different from others but I will be talking about my experiences). You have probably seen how American schools are portrayed in movies, as someone who used to be a student in the US I can say that for the most part it's pretty accurate.

In the morning you get picked up by a bright yellow school bus which makes a couple stops and eventually makes its way to school. You can also obviously get to school by car or on foot. Once you get to the school you have the choice of either eating breakfast in the cafeteria or waiting

for lessons to start in the gymnasium. Usually students have a couple of lessons in a row then a lunch break. During that lunch break you can either eat the food which is served at school consisting of a main dish like a burger, some vegetables for example green beans, a fruit cup and a beverage like milk or bring your own food from home. After the lunch break students have another lesson after which recess begins (recess is when students go outside for half an hour to play on the schools playground or field). After recess students have one more lesson and finally after that lesson you can either be picked up from school by your parents or be driven home by the school bus.

The next difference I can name is how certain holidays are celebrated. In the US Christmas Eve is not celebrated as it is in Poland. Americans tend to focus more on actual Christmas Day although milk and cookies are set out on Christmas Eve as a gift to Santa Clause and his reindeers. On Christmas morning presents are opened and on Christmas afternoon dinner is eaten with family and/or friends. The next holiday that is celebrated differently is Easter. In Poland Easter revolves more around religion where as in the USA it still obviously revolving religion but almost everybody celebrates it.

In the US Easter Eggs (which are plastic eggs filled with things like toys, a candy or even a money) are hid in the garden or a house for children to find as a form of celebration.

The last difference I wish to bring up today is food. You probably won't be surprised when I tell you that the stereotype of Americans eating a lot of fast food is usually true of course not in every case. A typical American meal for example can be: burgers, mac and cheese, or fried chicken. In the US there is a lot of food from different countries since a lot of people from all around the world live there so it is not uncommon to eat foreign food on a daily basis.

There are obviously so many other differences but those will be the only ones we cover today. So would you like to live in the US? Can you name another differences?
